

THE SANTA SUIT QUILT INSTRUCTIONS



Finished Quilt Size: 38 in x 46 in (96.52 cm x 116.84 cm)

KIT INCLUDES:

- 59 pieces - 8 ½ in x 8 ½ in (21.59 cm x 21.59 cm) pre-cut, Cotton squares in adorable prints from the story
- 30 pieces - 8 ½ in x 8 ½ in (21.59 cm x 21.59 cm) pre-cut, Flannel squares to make your quilt soft and cozy
- 1 piece - 8 ½ in x 8 ½ in (21.59 cm x 21.59 cm) pre-cut, Velvet square of Santa's Suit to add a touch of Christmas magic
- *The Santa Suit Quilt* storybook
- 6 in x 4 ¼ in (15.24 cm x 10.8 cm) Gift Tag

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- Sewing machine
- Coordinating thread
- Iron and pressing surface

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Read all instructions before beginning project. If desired, press cotton and flannel fabrics with a dry iron on cotton setting. Do not press velvet. Use ½ in (1.27 cm) seam allowance.

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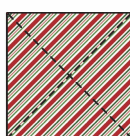
SEWING

1. Select a Cotton A square (Front) and a matching square (Back). Layer squares **wrong** sides together with a White Flannel square between. Align edges, pin and sew an "X" through the center (Dia. A). **Optional: Check orientation of the directional designs before pinning.** Repeat with all 12 Cotton A, Cotton B, Cotton C and Cotton D fabric designs, making 6 blocks of each. Repeat with 10 Cotton E squares to make 5 blocks.

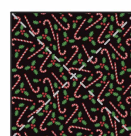

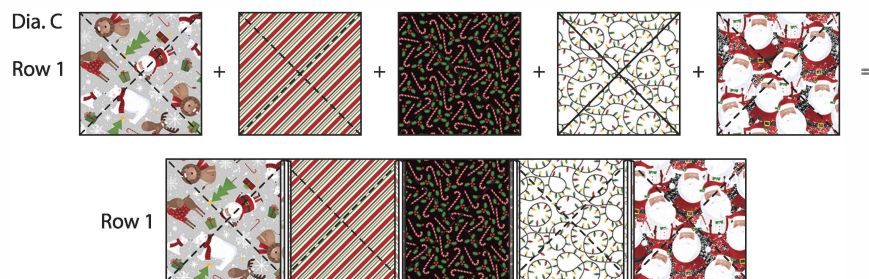
2. Select the Santa Suit Velvet square (Front) and the remaining Cotton E square (Back). Repeat the rest of Step 1 to make 1 Santa Suit Block (Dia. B).

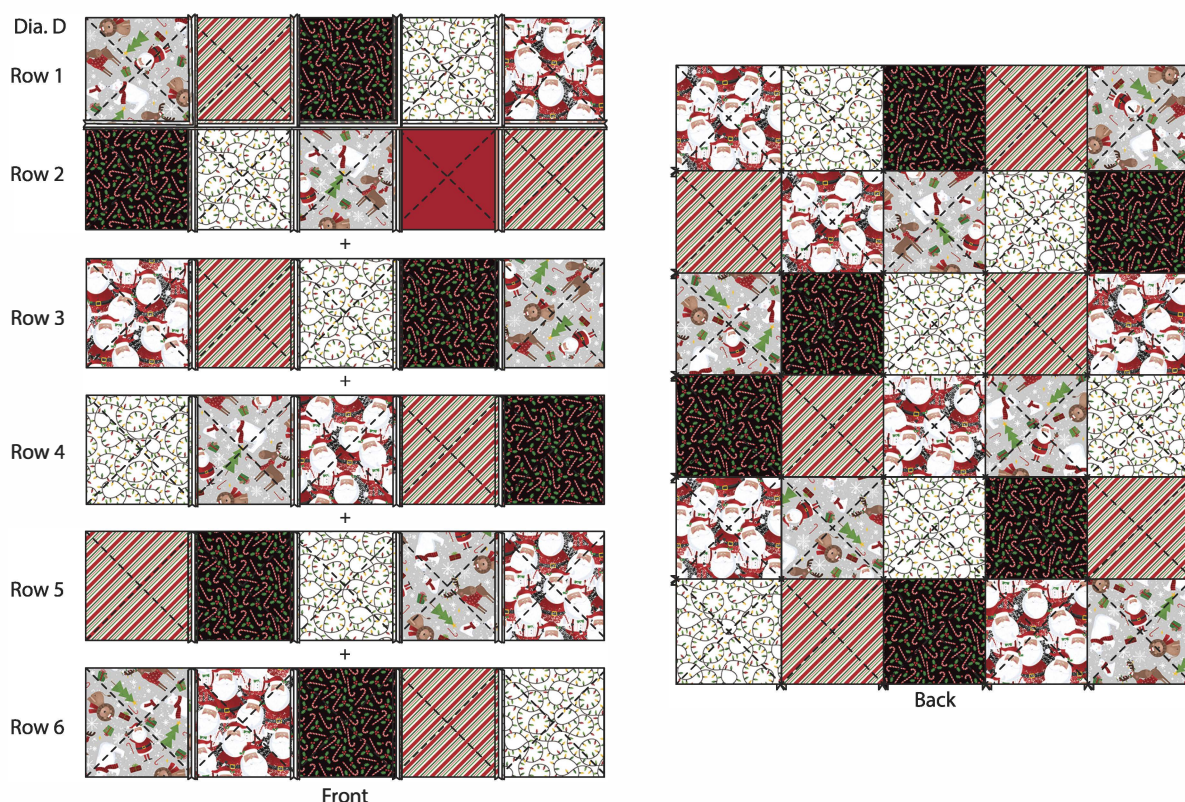

3. Starting with Row 1, arrange blocks as shown in Diagram C. Pin the first two squares together; sew along one side. **Note:** Check orientation of the directional designs before sewing. The seam edges will be on the Front, facing you. In the same manner, sew the next three squares to complete Row 1. Repeat for Rows 2 - 6, arranging blocks as shown in Diagram D.

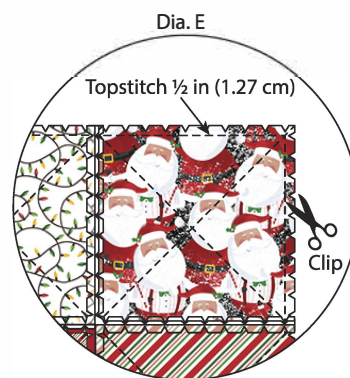


4. Pin Rows 1 and 2 with Back sides (side without the seam edges showing) together and seams matching. Sew, backstitching at the beginning and end of seams. Topstitch $\frac{1}{2}$ in (1.27 cm) around the outside edge of the blanket. Sew with the Front side up and open the seams as you sew over them (Dia. D).



FINISHING

5. Carefully clip all seams up to but not through the stitching line, approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ in (1.27 cm) apart, including the outside edge (Dia. E). **Note:** Clip through both layers at the same time being careful not to clip into the seam. **Tip:** Any sharp scissors will work, but spring-loaded scissors reduce hand fatigue. To fray and soften the cut fringe, machine wash with a mild soap in cold water, regular cycle; machine dry.
